Raising a Good Digital Citizen

Teaching children cyberspace manners- as well as how to be safe online- is important in this age of electronic communication. Here are key concepts your child should learn.

- Follow the Golden Rule: Treat others the way you want to be treated. Be positive, kind and respectful in all texts and posts.
- Remember that nothing that is shared electronically is really ever private. Others can copy or forward without asking you.
- Do not share passwords with anyone except your parents or guardians, or give out personal information to any you do not
- Get permission from people before you forward pictures or personal information about them.
- Not everyone online is who they say they are. Never get together in real life with someone you have "met" online without your parents' or guardian's OK.
- Before you install software or buy something online, get your parents' or guardians' permission.
- Be honest. Do not download things illegally or copy anything off the Internet and pretend that it's your own work.
- If you see something online that make you uncomfortable, tell your parents or guardians about it right away.
